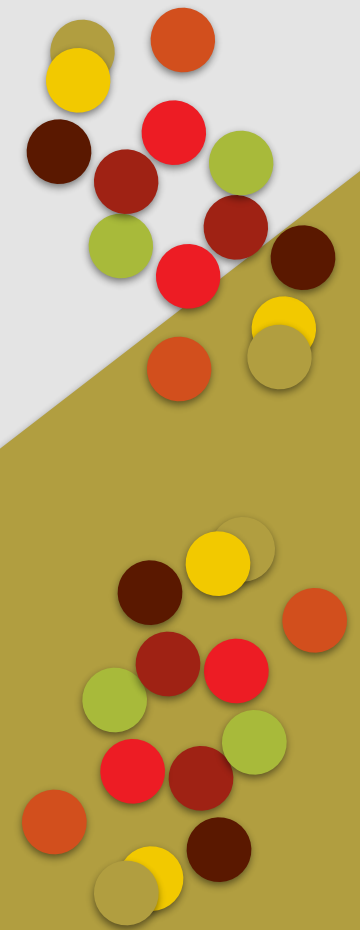
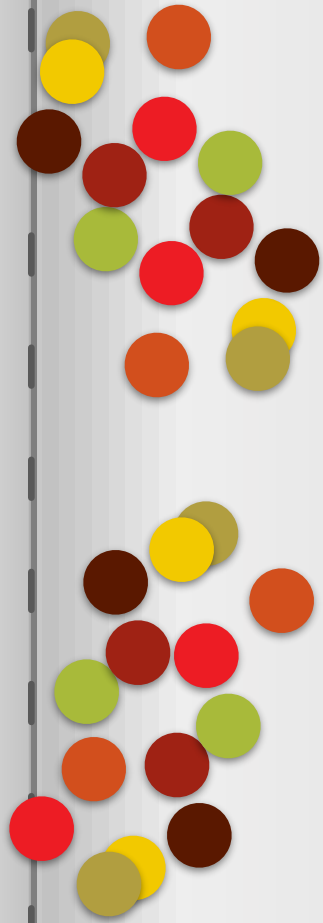


# **My Trip to the Southeast**

# A cotton plantation in Mississippi

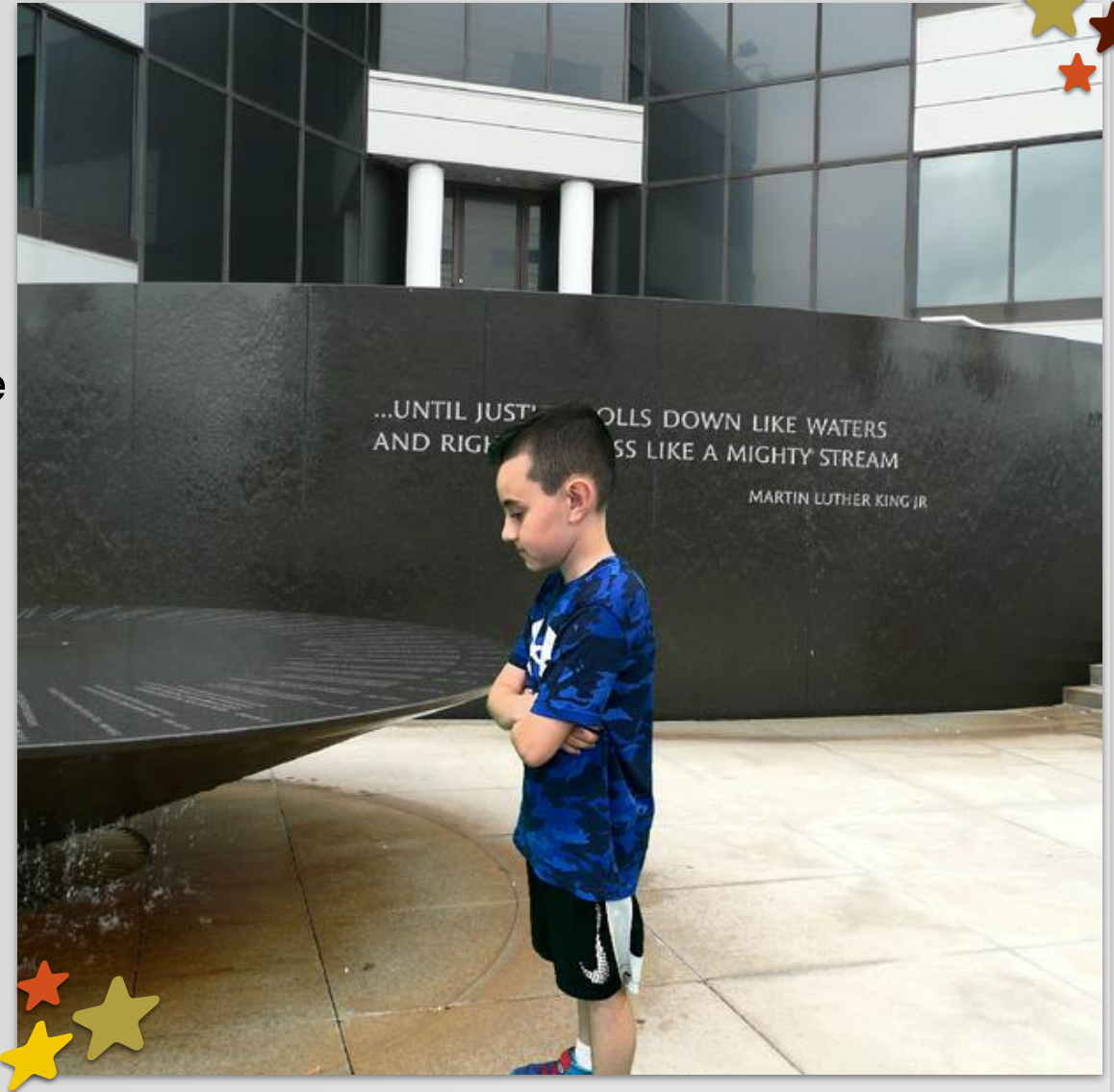
